NWAC INTERNATIONALLY

- NWAC is working on expanding its role globally through diplomatic exchanges and international engagement.
- NWAC participates in the annual sessions of various UN intergovernmental bodies including the UNPFII and the UNCSW, and frequently submits responses and documents to the United Nations.
- NWAC continues to build strong international relations through diplomatic exchanges with the embassies of countries that have indigenous populations. These are intended to promote cultural and educational exchanges on issues relevant to indigenous women.
- NWAC interacts with other international agencies, such as the European Union and the G7 delegates, for future cooperation on various projects.
