## INDIGENOUS PEOPLES AREA PROTECTED GROUP

The Canadian constitution INUIT legally recognizes B groups of Indigenous Peoples First NATIONS

Hundreds of communities across the country.

Despite their diversity, Indigenous Peoples in Canada are seen as A Distinct RACIAL/ETHNIC GROUP.



CANADA COMMITTED <u>ALL</u> ACTS PROHIBITED BY THE DEFINITION OF GENOCIDE

RESIDENTIAL "SCHOOLS" (1880-1996) - 150,000 children forcibly removed; - beaten, tortured, starved, raped

- prohibition to speak their language
- thousands of deaths

#### 3 CANADA HAS THE INTENT TO DESTROY INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

Contrary to a person, a State does not have a soul or thoughts. Its INTENT can only be proven by its policies and conduct.

CANADA HAS IMPLEMENTED A CONTINUOUS POLICY TO DESTROY INDIGENOUS PEOPLES PHYSICALLY, BIOLOGICALLY, AND AS SOCIAL UNITS

## Genocide is not just about massacres. Genocide encompasses 5 types of conduct



MURDER is only one of them (see p.3)

OUR LEADERS ARE NOT MURDERERS!

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## ENDING THE CANADIAN GENOCIDE OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES IS A LEGAL OBLIGATION
