- **NWAC is continuously working on expanding its role internationally through diplomatic exchanges and engagement with international stakeholders.**
- **NWAC participates in annual United Nations sessions and events like the United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues and the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women.**
- **NWAC creates shadow reports to comments on written statements and outcome documents produced by major international bodies.**
- **NWAC monitors the Government of Canada's implementation of their international human rights commitments by engaging in discussions on human rights, and participating in Canada's international human rights reviews like the Universal Periodic Review.**
- **NWAC is building strong international relationships through diplomatic exchanges to foster partnerships and knowledge exchanges with Indigenous peoples abroad.**
